

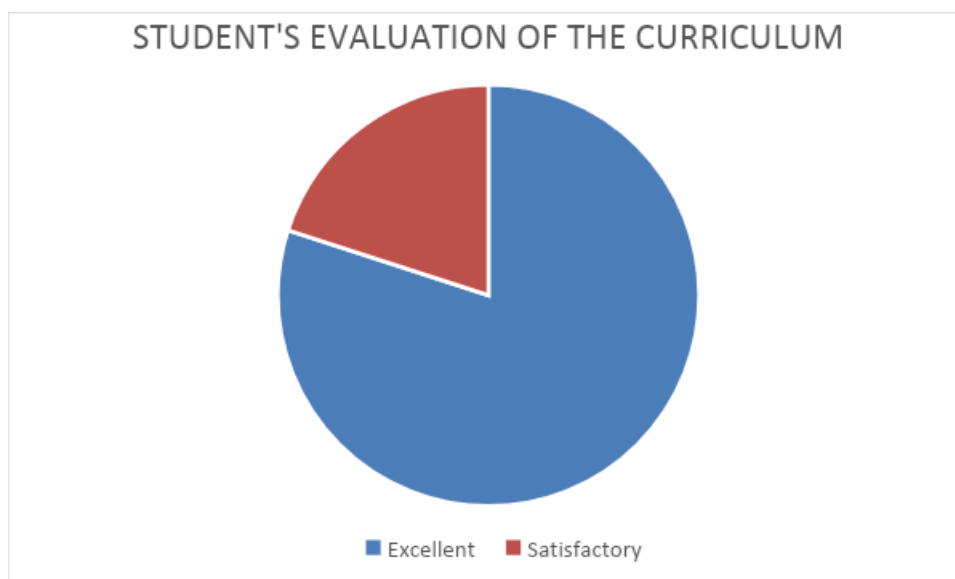

**Curriculum Feedback Analysis Report**  
**(Year: 2019-20)**

**Students Feedback**

Feedback on curriculum was collected from students in the following areas:

1. Knowledge and Concept
2. Analytical Abilities and Skill
3. Employability
4. Coverage of course through practical



A total of 25 Students gave feedback on curriculum.

The department considers students as a primary stakeholder of the academic setup. With this view, student's feedback is considered as an important source of information about the teaching-learning process.

Right since the beginning of the year students are asked to share feedback about the department as well as the curriculum developed for them. The department encourages students on continuous basis to give verbal feedback about the curriculum. In the first two months of the academic year, feedback is taken from the students on weekly basis about the teaching-learning process. At the end of both the semesters written feedback is taken regarding the curriculum and the functioning of the department.

During the weekly feedback session students are asked to verbally share their experience regarding the curriculum. In the initial four weeks students majorly stated difficulties in coping since they have to revisit the material several time to be able to confident about writing answers. However as they progressed towards the end of the semester, they were more confident about the study pattern and the content. Overall students were happy with the curriculum since it combined the theoretical knowledge of psychology with the practical knowledge. Although in the first term they found Psychological Testing very theoretical, once they understood its importance they were happy studying it.

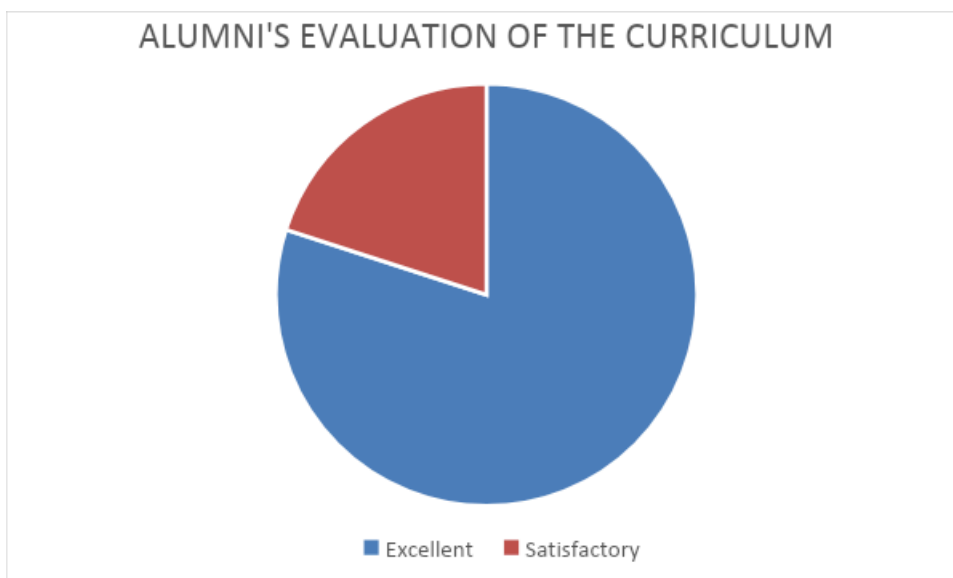

4. Coverage of course through practical



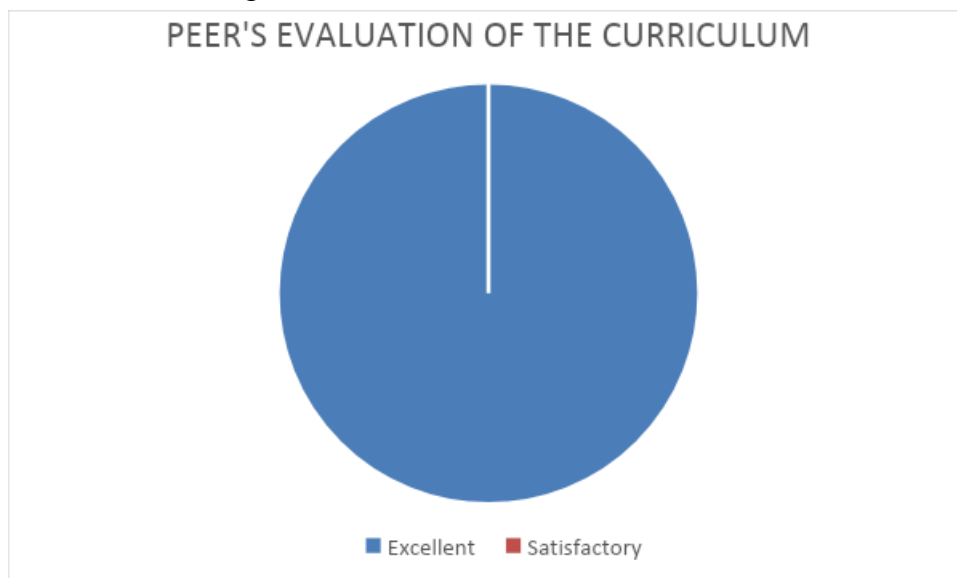

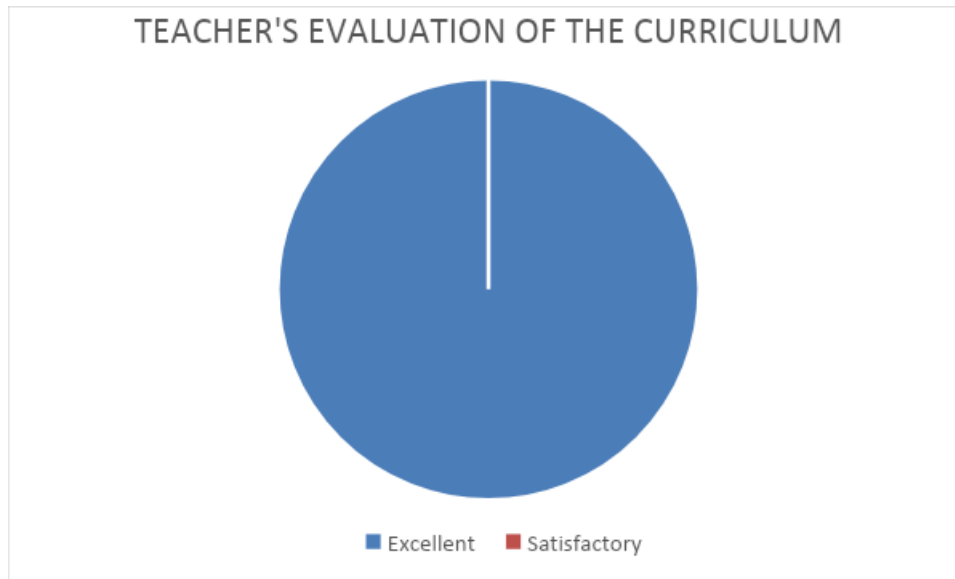
## Teacher Feedback
