**Actions taken report 2022-2023**

In the Academic year 2022-23, IQAC comprised 30 members, representing various stakeholders as per the NAAC guidelines. A multipronged strategy was designed by IQAC in Academic and Administrative activities for the promotion of quality.

In this academic year, IQAC conducted 4 official meetings (13-08-2022, 19-11-2022, 11-02-2023, 21-04-2023). Plan of action was prepared in the first meeting and IQAC reviewed the progress of the plans implemented in the subsequent meetings. Plan of action was carried out directly by IQAC and also suggestions were given to Departments / Non-Departmental Associations/ committees for various activities. Following activities were carried out by IQAC in the academic year 2022-23.
